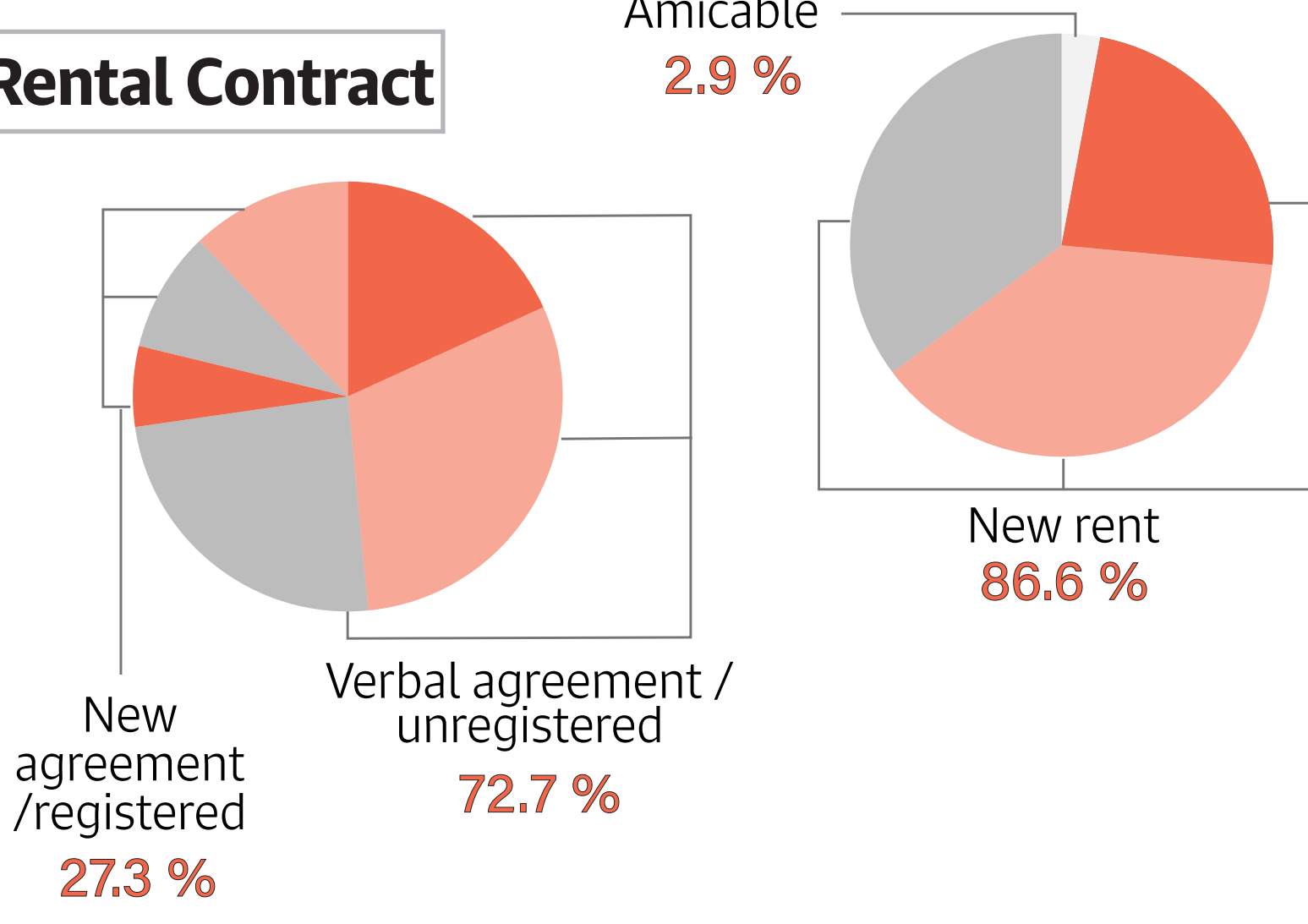

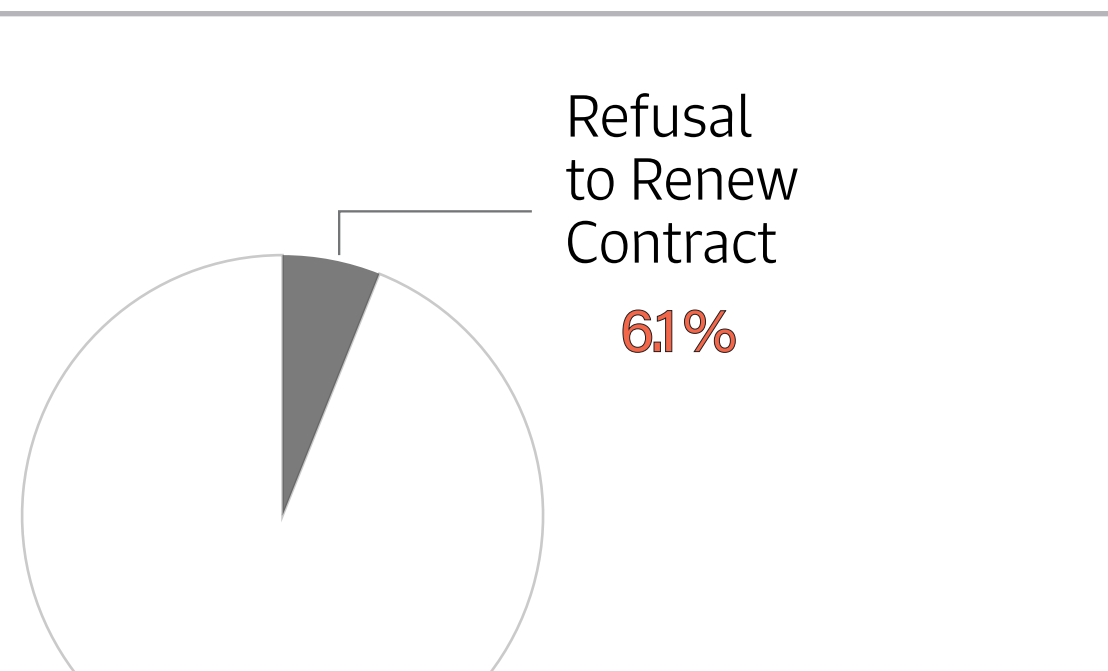
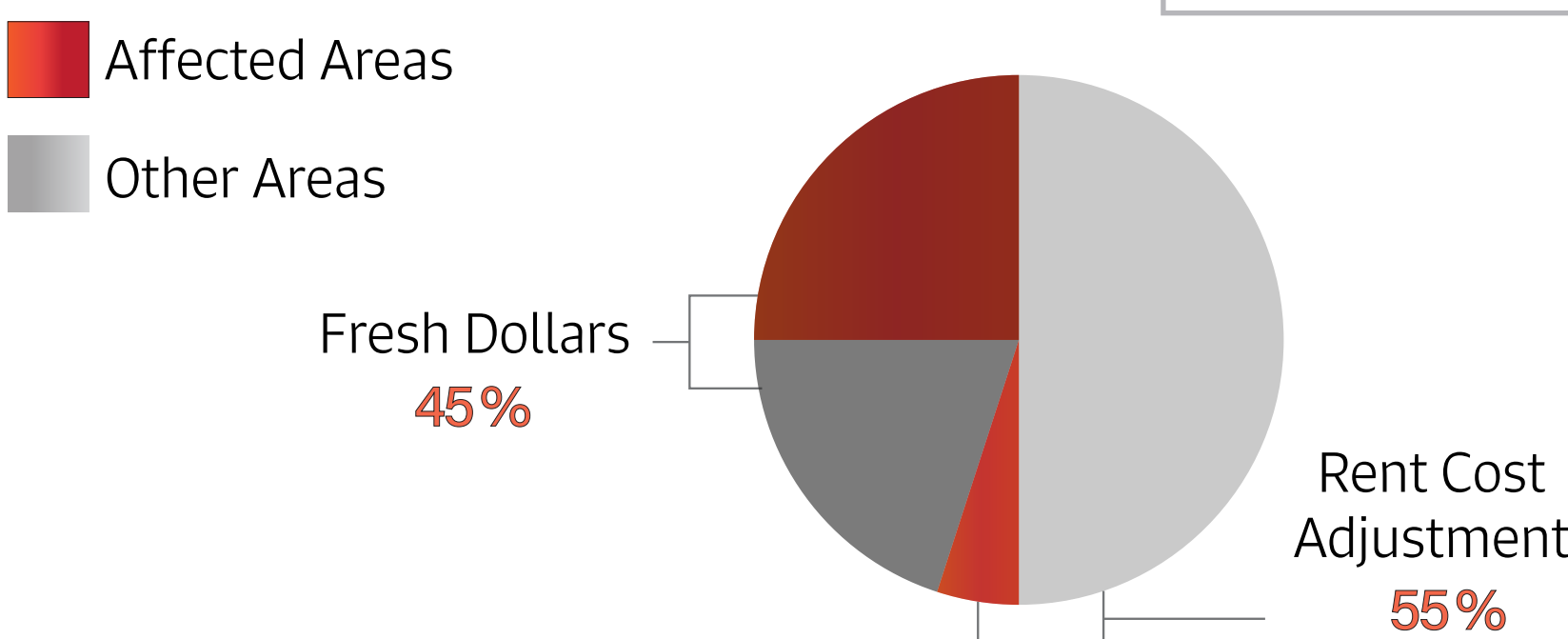


### Monthly Rent in LBP

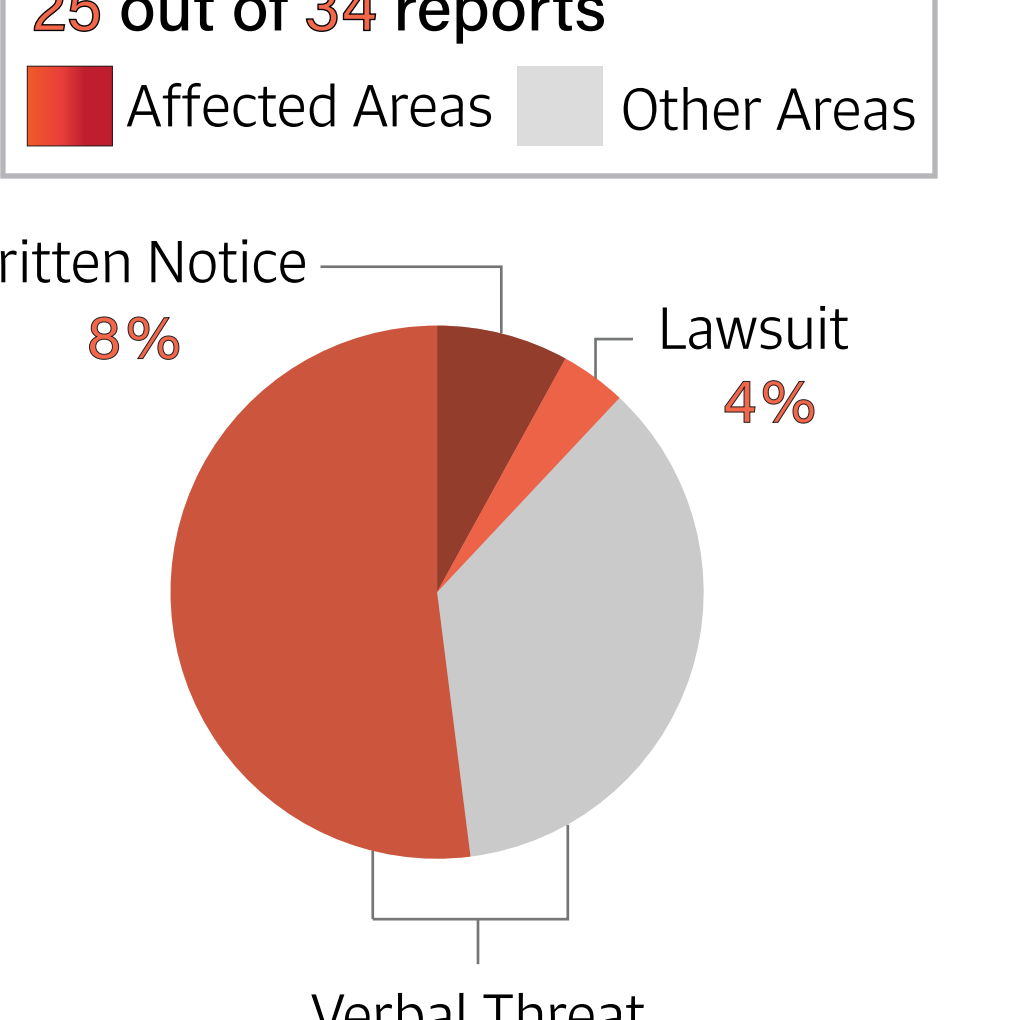

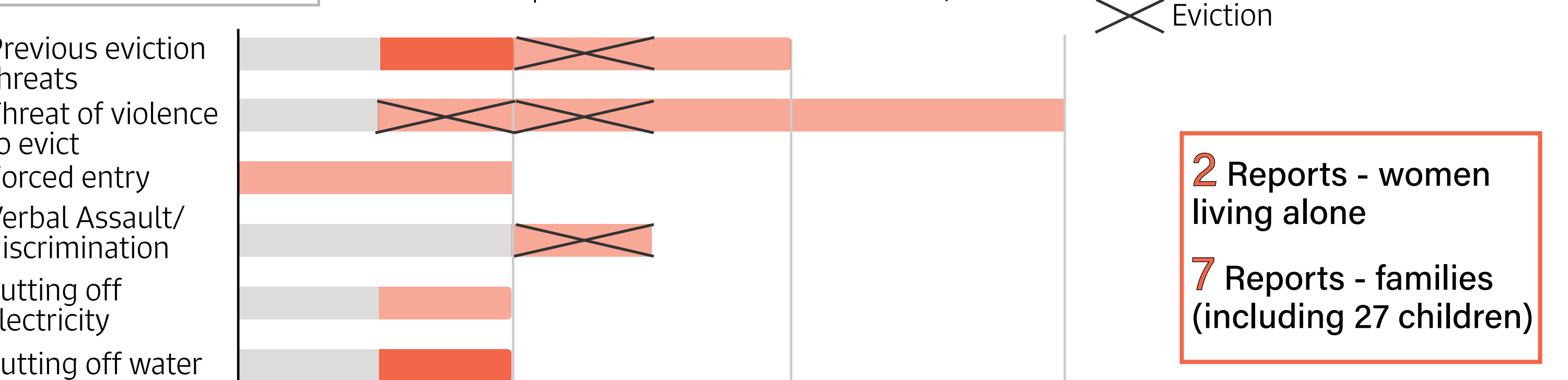

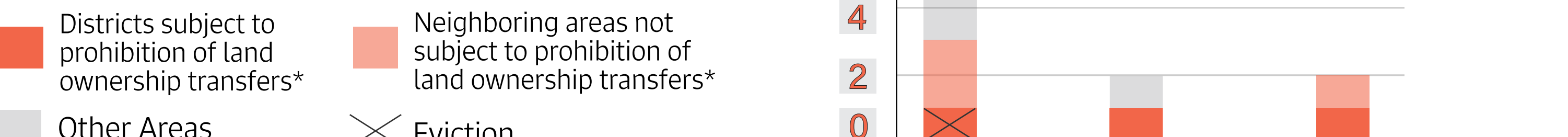
